Dear Parents.

'Change' - it poses a constant challenge and at the same time offers an opportunity to take next steps in developing for the better. One inevitable change that every child, parent and teacher faces year after year, is the change in grades and classroom environment. Specifically speaking, in Kindergarten, one week, children are in KG 1/ KG 2 and the following week they graduate to KG 2/ Grade 1. Within a span of a week to 10 days, we expect our children to grow overnight and do everything that is expected from the next grade child.

Looking at it from a child's point of view, it is certainly challenging for them to keep up to the changed expectations instantaneously. But if we can support children in managing this transition positively, then this period before the summer break can lay a strong foundation for a child to accelerate her/his learning once they are back. We have always seen a renewed eagerness to learn; and also a great increase in their volume of vocabulary, once they are back from summer vacations. So, how do we face this great big challenge of tiding over the first term, which certainly seems tumultuous to children, parents and teachers at times

First and foremost, we need to develop patience till the new academic year settles in and have trust in the child's innate ability to adapt to changes in her/ his own ways and support in developing resilience – the ability to adapt to adverse situations and still stay positive, in them. "Teaching is a magical thing. I truly believe it is a calling and much more than just "a job." It makes you smile, laugh, and cheer – yet I sometimes frown or even cry. It is both exhilarating and exhausting and I was surprised at how much work was involved with teaching. When I first started I thought that it would just be classroom work with the children and then I would leave my work at my job. However, there are trainings to attend and lesson plans to make and parent emails to answer. I was also surprised at how attached I have become to the children in my class and how much I will miss them when they move on. "I am often asked why I became a teacher", but truly, I love working with children. I love their curiosity and love of learning. I love seeing their eyes light up when they realize they can now read.

I recall the time - After introducing a topic of an Environmental sounds, I made the children wear the listening ears and asked them to listen carefully for the sounds around them, they had fun wearing big ears and showing each other and making sound of elephant. When I asked they need to be quiet and listen carefully, a child excitedly shouts to get my attention "Teacher, bus and imitating the noise with action moving backward showed bus reversing" I was very happy as this child of mine for the 1st week was unsettled and by the end of 2nd week he showed the confidence in him of learning, even though English being a challenge for him.

I really do think we make a huge difference as teachers. I don't mean just in the teaching of academics, but in children's and families' lives as well."

"It's interesting how the things we come across in our daily lives leave such a lasting impact. It's those moments that are small in time, but huge in the message they represent.

It was the 1st day of Kindergarten and I was busy welcoming all the kids with a warm hug and smile. When the class started after 10mins came another child with his father, who was frightened to enter the class. His father dropped him and walked away. I had to cajole and take him inside the class. My hug gave him such peace that he clanged to me for more than an hour, till he was comfortable to look around. This uplifted his spirits and confidence about his teacher and classmates and his class till date that child waits for me to smile and give him a warm hug every day in the morning, to kick start his day. Probably it gives him encouragement to learn something new every day.

This WOW moment made me pause to think about how humble and happy some kids are. How simple smile and even a small gesture of encouragement makes them genuinely happy. The thing they have in common is that genuine happiness only a child can generate.
