From the Principal's desk







The day was full of fun, laughter, excitement, friendship and memories!!!!











“Education means the ability to think independently and creatively, and development of the skill of applying one’s knowledge in dealing with people and situations in the real world.” As teachers we want our students to be able to use their knowledge to solve problems in the “real world”.

We do not want students to only memorize the concepts and examples we use, but instead to be able to use them later in life. This is equally important in math and science. Unfortunately, we do not know all of the situations that students will need to use the knowledge/skills we teach, but the best way to make them aware of transfer situations is to explicitly teach students when they can use the information. This will make them more likely to recognize situations in which they can apply their knowledge when they come up in the future. As KG 2 G teachers it was like feather in our hats when we heard appreciation from one of the parent. The parent was very much excited to go through the child’s profile and relate it to each and every situation that she could see that her daughter how beautifully applied in real life.






Reading Day
