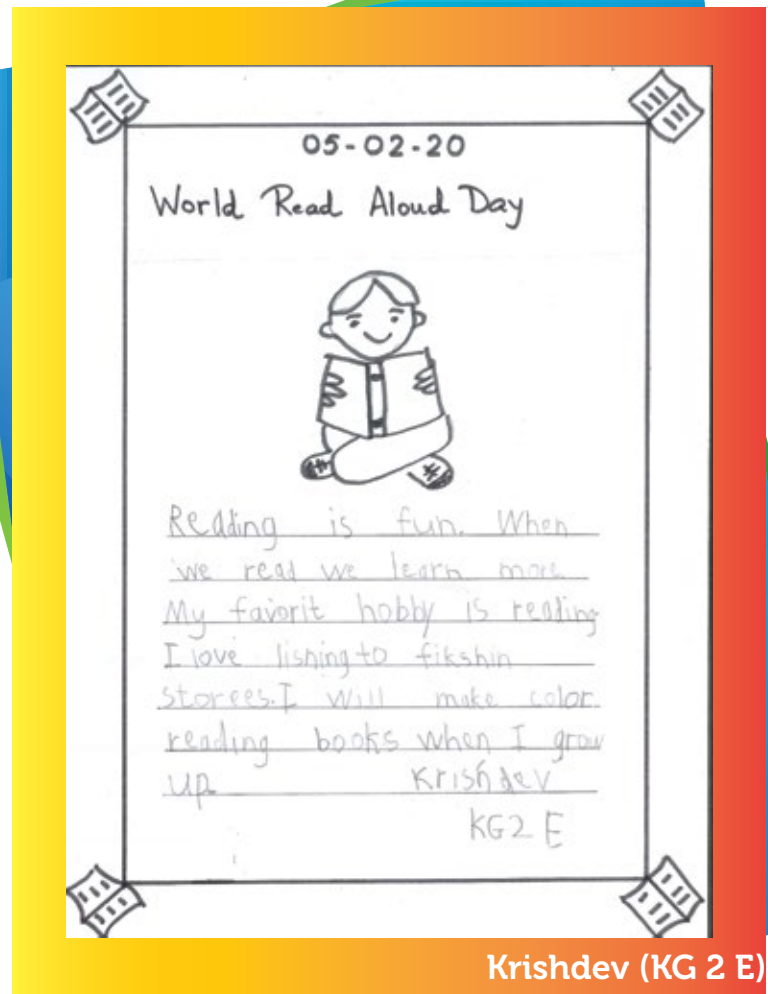

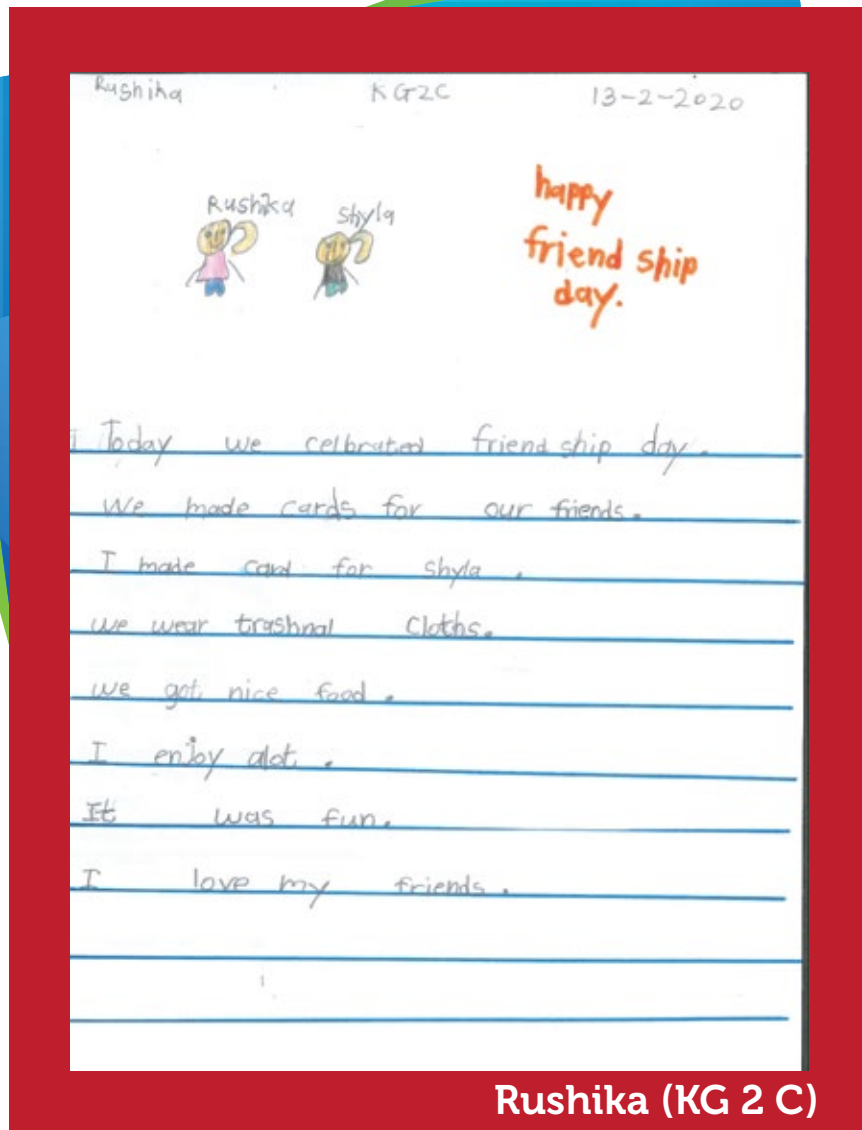
On the World read aloud day we share stories by reading aloud.

It was a wonderful experience. I did not want the camp to finish. When it was home time I felt sad.

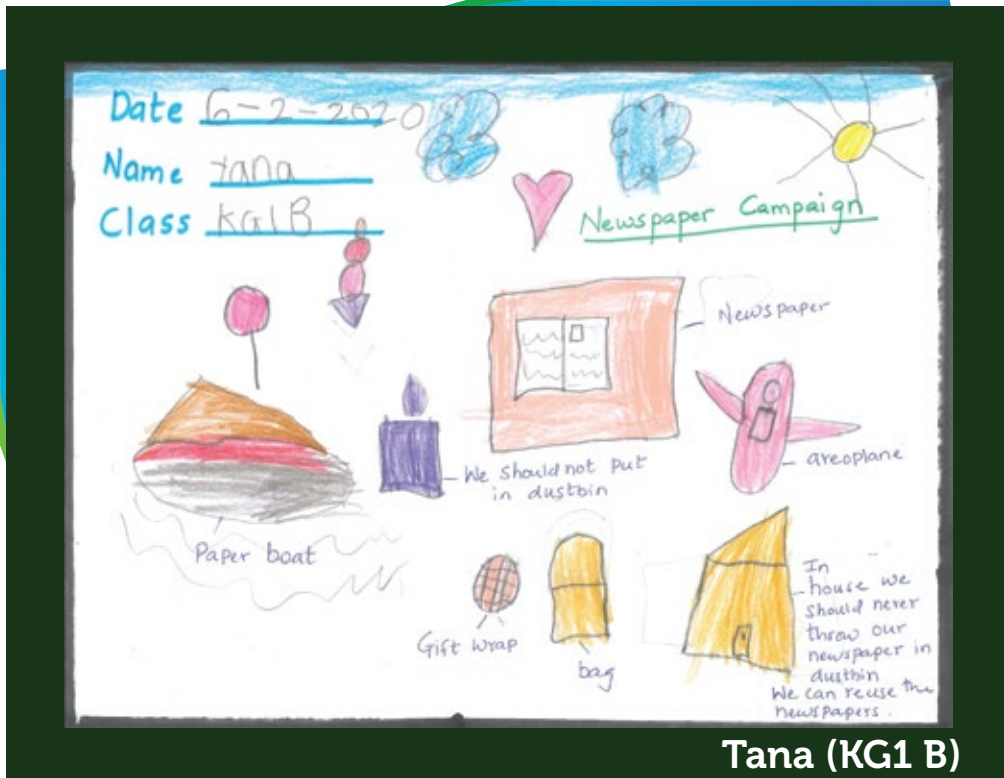
