I am a LSA in Ambassador Kindergarten. Working in a Kindergarten with the tender aged young ones is an experience of all kinds. Sometimes a roller coaster and sometimes a smooth sailing and everything in between.

I am a teacher who visits different classes and am greeted with warmth by teachers and students who I work with or not. Sparkling eyes of children, peals of laughter, welcome greetings, unexpected hugs, lots of compliments is not uncommon. It's the warmth in all these that makes up the first 'W' in the WOW.

However, as I was penning my experience down, there are two experience that came to my mind.

The first one goes like this. I worked with a child closely for 4 months. He was a nonverbal child in autism spectrum. He was a warm and affectionate child. I was overwhelmed when in the outdoor a child once pointed to me and told his teacher. "I know this teacher; she is so kind to my friend. She used to come to our class last year." That was a WOW as it was more than a statement, a testimony of all the best that we try to do for our students.

Being with young ones I learn, I unlearn, I am overwhelmed observing how they play, care and bond together. I can conclude and say that being with these little ones is a WOW experience in itself.

Wish to keep the kindness going in the class for long!




