Speech and Language Development in Children with the Specialist

Ms. Rupali Ranjith - Speech Therapist and Audiologist of Primacare Medical centre, Dubai conducted a session for the teachers of Ambassador School on the various aspects of speech and language development in children and the preparedness to handle children who struggle with understanding, speaking, reading, writing and listening skills - which affects the performance of the child in school.

Language is the base of verbal communication. The ability to communicate needs and to share thoughts and ideas to his or her peer group and teachers make significant difference not only in terms of knowledge but also in emotional and social growth.

In the current scenario, there is a much greater expectation from kids in their young developing years than in the past. The human brain develops more rapidly between birth and the age five (nearly 95%) than during any other subsequent period. Multiple functions of brain emerge and matures. One of which is speech and language. Some parents may not agree with the current needs as they do not want to force their child with social and educational requirements. By not providing right intervention at the right time we are depriving them of their opportunities to reach their highest potential. Many parents do not realize whether their child is delayed or developing age-appropriately in terms of speech and language. Here, are some red flags to understand when to seek professional help:

- 1. No consistent response to surrounding sounds till 6 months of age.
- 2. No eye contact by 6 months of age
- 3. No social smile or meaningful expressions of joy by 6 months of age.
- 4. No reciprocal social expressions with speaker by the age of 9 months.
- 5. No babbling by 12 months
- 6. Difficulty in expressing needs by pointing and social expression like waving bye by 12 months
- 7. No consistent response to name call by 12 months
- 8. No meaningful first word by 16 months
- 9. Difficulty in following commands by 18 months
- 10. No two-word meaningful phrases by 24 months
- 11. No turn-taking in conversation by 30 months
- 12. Any loss of speech or babbling or social skills (like eye contact) at any age.

Early intervention help significantly in reducing early struggles. It gives them freedom to express which enhances emotional, social and personal growth.
